Safe water to the neighboring community in Bulega has been prioritized. We are pleased that the people are fully benefiting from the recently constructed 3rd borehole in the village. For over 8 months, this borehole has served as a source of safe water for the community.

Today, the 3rd borehole is a little congested as one of the other boreholes has been out of order for quite some time. It is with great joy that Ven. Bhante Buddharakkhita has extended a hand promising to have the dysfunctional borehole repaired by the end of April. This will help reduce the congestion and provide dwellers of the Bulega community quicker access to safe and clean water.

- On Friday April 8, 2016, the Uganda Buddhist Centre will join other Buddhist followers in the world to celebrate the International Buddhist Day (IBD).

Eight (8) members from eight member countries will represent the African Buddhist Union at the United Nations Vesak Day Celebrations and Peace Forum, in May 2016 in Thailand. The eight countries are: Rwanda, DR Congo, Burundi, Egypt, Cameroon, Uganda, Nigeria, and Botswana. Later, members will convene a meeting to discuss the activities and the future of the African Buddhist Union in Africa.

What is African Buddhist Union?

The African Buddhist Union (ABU) is an umbrella non-profit organization for African Buddhists, African Buddhists in the diaspora, and friends of African Buddhists, headquartered at the Uganda Buddhist Centre. ABU was formed by Venerable Buddharakkhita with a mission of cultivating a spirit of mutual friendship and good fellowship among African Buddhists through activities such as study of the Dhamma, practice of meditation and promotion of Buddhist ethics and values for social action.
