EXPANSION OF OUR KITCHEN

Our kitchen has undergone a significant expansion, creating a more conducive and spacious environment for our chefs. This enhancement is set to significantly boost the efficiency and effectiveness of meal preparation for the monastics and our community. The additional space has eliminated the congestion that previously hampered movement and workflow, enabling the kitchen staff to carry out their tasks with efficiency. We also purchased spiral dough mixer to streamline food preparation processes, ensuring smoother and more efficient kitchen operations.

The kitchen expansion also reflects our commitment to sustainable energy-efficiency. We use mostly briquettes for cooking which a smarter way of cooking and this was chosen to reduce our environmental footprint and promote environmental stewardship within our community.

The school has received a fresh coat of paint, revitalizing its appearance and creating a more vibrant and welcoming atmosphere for students. Inspired by the transformative potential of mindfulness, this group from Katwe has decided to continue their practice and join our Bunga Centre. Now, every Saturday, they come together with our community to practice yoga, meditation, and engage in guided Dhamma discussions. Their commitment and enthusiasm enrich our sessions, fostering a deeper sense of connection and shared purpose within our growing community.

ACQUISITION OF PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM

To improve our communication during events and gatherings, we have purchased a new P.A. sound system. This system will ensure clear and effective communication, fostering better engagement during community activities. Whether during meditation sessions, educational programs, or special events, this sound system will enhance the overall experience for everyone involved.

The system includes a professional power Amplifier P-3000 200; one free-range top speaker and one base; DBX power sequence controller; DBX graphics equalizer; DBX 3-way crossover and a 4-channel microphone kit along with their accessories.
